What is The Sports Premium?

Aim

The Primary Sports Premium is Funding to improve the quality of PE and Sport in schools that have primary school age children. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils in the 2019 to 2020 academic year and to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. In each year all schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. With 101 pupils of primary age (4.9.19) this equates to £1710 for this academic year.

How the funding will be paid

Funding is included in the additional grant for schools (AGS)

Heltwate School will receive their funding directly from the Department's special education needs and disability division.

Why is there a Sports Premium?

Purpose of the funding

Schools **have to** spend the funding on improving their provision for PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Heltwate school uses the funding to enhance existing PE provision and expertise within school.

Examples of how the Sports Premium has been spent during 2018/19.

Youth Dreams and Tiny Tykes Coaching

Heltwate School employ's Sports Coaches from the Youth Dreams Company who lead specialist PE lessons, they assist with Wake and Shake in School and running a lunch time Football Club.

Youth Dreams invoice Heltwate each term and the total for the year is T.B.C.

Tiny Tykes provides an EYFS specialist PE provision, they use cross-curricular links to literacy, teaching PE through stories, linking to the class topics. Tiny Tykes have

increased their hours over the COVID period to help support Key Workers and Vulnerable pupils.

Both companies have provided invaluable INSET for Heltwate Staff.

The Jack Hunt Primary PE Partnership

Heltwate School is a member of the Jack Hunt Community Learning Trust.

The Jack Hunt Primary PE Partnership works to develop a progressive and coordinated structure for Physical Education and Sport for schools linked to it. This partnership provides, supports and enhances opportunities for young people to start, stay and succeed in high quality activity in and beyond the curriculum.

The Jack Hunt Partnership also inform school about relevant training opportunities which will be funded from Sports Premium.

- C) A range of additional equipment is also purchased to support the above activities and additional opportunities which arise during the year.

Heltwate School have links to the Jack Hunt Community Learning Trust via-

- A) PE Coordinators Meetings for Primary School PE Leads & Heltwate School PE Subject Lead.
- B) Students from Jack Hunt come to work with Heltwate School Groups at a range of festivals and Sports Day.

Sports Premium money has also been used to fund transport to:-

- A) Inter School competitions
- B) Heltwate's personalised Festivals at Jack Hunt School

£16,565 was spent between Sept 2019 - Aug 2020

Any underspend because of COVID-19.

We will use this money to create equipment packs for each class bubble this will allow the children to continue to develop their gross motor skills. Gross motor skills has been an area identified by Heltwate staff and coaches that the students need to develop in order to help them gain confidence with, day to day tasks, physical activities and become more physically literate.
