Attendance for the 2023 / 24 School Year 91%. This is nearly 4% higher than the Special School National Average of 87.1%

98 students have exceeded our school target of 94% attendance.

Thank you to all the parents and carers who have supported us this year with making sure your child is at school and that they are on time every day. You are supporting them in making sure they don't miss out on important social and learning experiences throughout the year. Thank you also to those who have improved their child's attendance following communication from us.

We have an identified small number of students who have had unauthorised absences this year. This may be due to unauthorised holidays, absence where the reason is not acceptable, or being late after registration has closed.

A new attendance record begins at the start of each academic year - therefore every child has the potential to achieve high attendance from September.

New Attendance Regulations for schools from September 2024

You may have seen in the media that there are national changes from September regarding Leave of Absence taken in term time and unauthorised absence. Peterborough Local Authority are currently reviewing this and we will be able to share more in September.

We strongly discourage leave of absence and can only consider leave for exceptional circumstances – family holidays <u>DO NOT</u> count as exceptional circumstances so do not presume that as your child attends a Special School that this will be authorised.


