Attendance

We have seen a slight increase in attendance this half term to 91.2%, compared to 90.7% last half term. The total for the school year up to 25th May is 90.1%. We are however still lower than our target of 94%. If your child only has attendance of 90% it means they are missing a whole day every 2 weeks. For the most this isn't really good enough.

Please support us by minimising the absences from school – particularly taking leave of absence for holidays during term time. Leave for family holidays will NOT be authorised – the government states that "children should be in school".

Leave of Absence

Heltwate School will only authorise Leave of Absence under exceptional circumstances. The Governors of Heltwate School consider that 'exceptional' circumstances do not occur regularly by definition and are one off occasions. **HOLIDAYS WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED.**

Requests for exceptional leave of absence should be made at least 4 school weeks in advance and will be considered on an individual basis by the Headteacher as delegated by the Governing Body, (or in their absence by a Deputy Headteacher). Forms are available to download from the school website:
