Pupils return to school on MONDAY 17th April at 8.40 a.m.


World Book Day – My Future event

Attendance

The whole school attendance percentage for this school term is 91.1% and for the school year up to 30th March is 90.1%

We remain above the national average for Special School attendance which is 86.4%.

115 pupils this term have over 94% attendance which is our school target – and 32 of these were 100%. Well done!

Moving house

Transport may not be able to organise the change immediately and so you would need to bring your child to school yourself whilst it is being done.

Parent / Carers vehicles onsite

Please can we remind those who bring and collect their child into school that <u>the school site</u> <u>cannot be accessed between 8.40 a.m. – 9.00 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. - 3.15 p.m. by parent / carer <u>vehicles</u>. If you do come onto site during these times you will be asked to move your vehicle.</u>

Class Dojo

Please make sure you are signed up to class dojo and regularly check it – we use it for all communication between school and home.

School Transport

All transport is managed by Peterborough City Council. If you need to speak to the transport team about your child's transport please ring 01733 317455 and NOT the school office.

School Dinners

Dinners are £2.70 a day for Years 3-6 and £2.90 a day for Year 7 upwards. Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and 2 do not need to pay.

We have a new menu starting after the Easter holiday and is available to view on our website.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

Peterborough City Council have secured funding for the next year to distribute vouchers during the school holidays for families who are eligible.

If your child is going to be late please be aware that school dinners have to be ordered by 9.30 a.m. so if you have not contacted us before then and bring your child into school late then they will need to provide them with a packed lunch.
