Dear Parents and Carers,

The students were tasked with sorting different leaves from the trees, looking at shape, size and pattern. From here we then identified the different trees in our allotment and learnt their names. We then went on a minibeast hunt, thinking about the different animals we could find, where they live and then using a chart to classify what we had found. School Transport

All transport is managed by Peterborough City Council. If you need to speak to the transport team about your child's transport please ring 01733 317455 and NOT the school office.

Moving house

Please be aware that when you move house you need to contact the transport office on 01733 317455 so they can re-arrange your transport as your move could mean your child being on a different transport route. Transport may not be able to organise the change immediately and so you would need to bring your child to school yourself whilst it is being done.



Please make sure that you let the school office know your new address.

Parent / Carers vehicles onsite

Please can we remind those who bring and collect their child into school that <u>the school site</u> <u>cannot be accessed between 8.40 a.m. – 9.00 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. - 3.15 p.m. by parent / carer</u> <u>vehicles</u>. If you do come onto site during these times you will be asked to move your vehicle.

School Dinners

Dinners are currently £2.70 a day for Years 3-6 and £2.90 a day for Year 7 upwards. There will be a price increase in September. Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and 2 do not need to pay.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

Peterborough City Council have secured funding for the next year to distribute vouchers during the school holidays for families who are eligible.

If your child is going to be late please be aware that school dinners have to be ordered by 9.30 a.m. so if you have not contacted us before then and bring your child into school late then they will need to provide them with a packed lunch.
