

Heltwate School Progress and Achievements

Academic Year 2022- 2023

As we have a whole school child-centred approach, it is clear that no two children can be assessed and compared against the same outcomes.

We have introduced Pupil Progress dialogue meetings to enable us to monitor the achievements / progress of each child in each class against clear and challenging teacher expectations, which are based on each pupil's starting point and future goals, dreams and aspirations.

Teachers make professional judgements on their pupils and whether or not they are working towards meeting their (teacher set) expectations, and this is backed up by evidence on the school based system, Earwig.

These expectations are continually assessed throughout the year by the class leads, new targets are set and tasks and sessions are planned to allow for opportunities to achieve. Each class lead meets with their line manager/SLT member to review each individual pupils' achievements within the school, we talk about these, review evidence and discuss next steps and look for resolutions if there are external factors which are hindering achievement. Evidence from all these meetings has been collated and we can track-back to each individual pupil discussion that took place.
